

Availability: Field trips are generally available all day Monday, 8-2 on Tuesday, and 8-12 on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. Groups are limited to 60 students at a time, and chaperones are expected to be an active part of the experience. Field Trips are NOT available April 23-May 7.



ACADEMIC FIELD TRIPS AND SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Field trips to the Thomas Township Nature Center are typically dvided into an indoor component and an outdoor experience. The indoor component can consist of full group instruction, multiple activity stations, and small groups. The outdoor component can consist of a hike to the observation deck, a scavenger hunt, search and identification of plants or animals, pond dipping, and other related activities.

Chaperones' assistance during activities is an integral part of the experience.

Academic Field Trip topics are connected to State Curriculum Expectations, but can be adjusted for multiple grade levels.

ABOUTTHE NATURE CENTER!

Thomas Township Nature Center: The Nature Center building was built in 1968 as the Hidden Hollow Restaurant and Lounge before becoming the Heritage Insurance Agency. It became the Thomas Township Nature Center and opened in August 2023. The nature center is a 4,000 sq. ft. building built over water that has two bathrooms, a historical display area, program space, seating areas that overlook the nature preserve, an indoor habitat area, a touch table, a children's interactive area and a small kitchenette. There are plenty of independent activities to entertain and educate our visitors.









ABOUTTHE NATURE PRESERVE!

Thomas Township Nature Preserve: The Nature Preserve has been around for a long time as Native American fishing grounds along a trail on the Tittabawassee River, farm land, a golf course, and a natural space. The Thomas Township Nature Preserve opened to the public in 2023. The 67-acre preserve has gravel trails along a berm around the most of the perimeter of the preserve. The gravel extends .5 miles to a two-story observation desk on the east side and .3 miles to a bridge on the west side. The north end is a rustic trail. In the interior of the preserve, there are multiple native-planting areas and grass trails. Additional amenities and native plants will be added to the preserve as we grow.
